



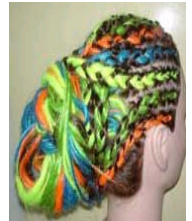

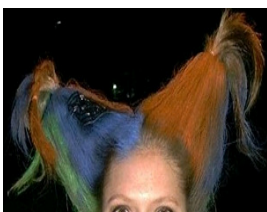

Alopecia Areata is hair loss from the scalp, eyebrows, eyelashes and the body. It's an auto immune condition. Our immune system is what attacks germs that would make us sick. In this case the body treats its hair follicles as foreign tissue (germs) and slows down or stops hair growth, but the hair never dies, so the hair always has the potential to regrow. It is not contagious and it doesn't cause any physical pain. **There is no cure!**

Types of Alopecia Areata:

Alopecia Areata:

Alopecia Areata, the most common variation of the autoimmune disease, presents itself as round, smooth patches of various sizes.

Alopecia Areata Totalis:

Alopecia Areata Totalis presents itself as total loss of hair on the scalp.

Alopecia Areata Universalis:

Alopecia Areata Universalis is the rarest form of Alopecia Areata and presents itself as the loss of hair over the entire scalp, eyebrows and body.
